In 1995, **Mercedes Ramirez Johnson** narrowly escaped a commercial airplane crash that resulted in the fatalities of 160 individuals, including her parents. Prior to her career as a speaker, Mercedes spent nearly a decade in high-level sales roles within the pharmaceutical and medical software industries. As a record-breaking, multimillion-dollar producer, she achieved the distinction of becoming the youngest female and sole Latino account executive at Cerner Corporation.
